

**Barts Charity Lectureships at Barts and the London School of Medicine and Dentistry,
Queen Mary University of London**

These lectureships are non-clinical 3 year fixed-term positions, with a support package of a Research Assistant and £75,000 consumables. This is open to candidates who can demonstrate that they are able to build on our existing strengths and additional capacity to our areas of excellence. They offer an early career researcher (ECR) a route to formally enhance their development to group leader and independent roles. The candidate will be asked to provide 6 monthly updates of their research progress, papers and grant application preparation to the Dean for Research and which will be shared on an annual basis with Barts Charity.

The first two years of the lectureships will be geared to enabling early career researchers to develop their existing research strengths, as well as their next projects, and where possible through inter-disciplinary initiatives, taking advantage of external funding opportunities. There will be opportunity to shape the research agenda of the Faculty including where appropriate, cross-Faculty initiatives. At the end of the second year the Institute Director and Dean for Research will assess if the candidate is to be consolidated into the institute and offered a tenured lectureship or senior lectureship at the end of the 3-year lectureship.

We expect these academics to provide the energy and dynamism for developing new cross-campus research collaborations, including interdisciplinary projects, with the awareness of the opportunities available in external funding initiatives.

There is no limit or restrictions on the area of research, though interests should complement the research strategy of the Faculty (www.qmul.ac.uk/smd/research/). Applications are particularly welcomed from those with experience of interdisciplinary research who could contribute to the further development of the Faculty's interdisciplinary links.

Documents Candidate applications should consist of a completed online application form and an accompanying CV of no more than four A4 sides.

Within the 5,000 character limit, the application should:

- briefly summarise research
- explain how it fits with existing strengths at the SMD
- set out a plan for how research will be developed further over the next three years.

The panel will consist of the SMD Dean for Research, Research Deanery Manager, 2 members of the SMD Research Deanery, relevant SMD Institute Director/specialist in the candidate's broad research area and a representative from Barts Charity. It is expected that many applicants may already be in possession of external funded scholarships and may wish to bring these to the SMD with a view to obtaining a permanent post, this should be made clear within the application form.
